She expressed her willingness to go and had made many plans to that end. When but a girl of sixteen she gave her heart to Christ, and has been a member of the Bethel Methodist Episcopal

Sadie was a bright and cheerful young lady; and was often spoken of as a model young girl. She was a friend to everyone. To know her was to love her. She was affectionate kind, and grateful to all. She was an active worker in the church; was teacher of the infant class in the Sunday school when her health failed her and compelled her to resign.

On Saturday evening about 7:00 o'clock, the angel of death entered the home to claim her.

She leaves to mourn her loss her beloved mother, who has cared for her throughout her entire illness, also three brothers and four sisters, and a host of relatives and friends. Especial sympathy is extended to the because family as this is the second time during the past two weeks that death has entered the home.

Short funeral services were held at the home and later at the Bethel church conducted by the Rev. Wm. Odel, of Viola, Iowa. Interment was made in the Bethel cemetery.
