Old Citizen Of Lynnville Passes Away

Thomas Albert Thompson was born Sept. 6, 1853, in LaSalle county, Ill., and died in Lynnville Sunday, Jan. 29; at the age of 79 years, 4 months and 23 days. He was one of a family of six children. Funeral services were held at the Friends church Tuesday aftermoon with Rev. Giles Youngquist in charge. Music was furnished by Mrs. Will Allee and Mrs. Charles Wagaman, with Mrs. A. F.
