Lucile Virginia Tough, 70, rural Kellogg, died Thursday, Sept. 19, at Grinnell Regional Medical Center of heart failure.

Graveside services were held Sunday, Sept. 22, at Saum Cemetery, rural Kellogg.

She was born Oct. 25, 1925, in Buena Vista Township, rural Kellogg, the daughter of Steel H. and Mary Andreas Watts. She was a graduate of Kellogg High School and following her marriage Feb. 18, 1945, to Donald C.
