Services Held For Dr. Guy Trimble, In Montezuma Practice For 60 Year

Funeral services for a long time Montezuma physician, Dr. Guy C. Trimble, were held Monday afternoon, August 15, at the Steffy Funeral Home. The Rev. Howard Hayes, pastor of the Montezuma Methodist Church, conducted the services. Music was provided by organist Miss Alice Underwood.

Dr. Trimble practiced in Montezuma for over 60 years, having established his practice here in January, 1906.
