Turner, pioneer resident of Jasper county and one of its most successful and wealthy farmers, died at his home in Turner Monday morning at 10.30 o'clock, following an illness of several months, the cause of which was hardening of the ayteries and other complications growing out of his advanced are

advanced age.

Mr. Turner moved to Jasper county in 1868 from his native state of Kentucky, shortly after the close of the Civil war, in which he served as a member of Company H. Twelfth Kentucky Volunteer Infantry. He had only a small capital and for the first few years of his residence here taught school and farmed, gradually accumulating more land until he owned several shundred acres of land any this county as well as a large tract in South Dakota.

He was a native of Kentucky born in Wayne county, April 23,71840 heins eighty-one years old at the time of his death. In 1872 he was united in marriage to Miss Elizabeth A. Rice, also a native of Kentucky, and too them were born seven children five of whom with the mother are left to mourn the death of the author and husband.
