Mr. Van Dyke rites today

Jacob (Jake) Van Dyke, 77, of Rte. 3, Grinnell, died Monday morning, Aug. 30, at his home.

Funeral services were conducted at 1:30 p.m. today at the Grinnell First Friends Church, with the Rev. Keith Briggs, pastor of the church, and the Rev. Ralph Menning, pastor of the Sully First Reformed Church, officiating. Pianist was Wanda Larsen, and vocalist was Francis Graves. Pallbearers were Bill DeKruyff, Jerry DePenning, Bruce Jacobs, Glen Van Dyke, Marvin Van Dyke and Robert Van Dyke. Burial was at the Sully Cemetery, with the Smith Funeral Home in charge of arrangements.

The son of Cornelius and Katherine Bandstra Van Dyke, he was born May 17, 1905, near Oskaloosa. He attended rural school. He was married to Sarah Van Roes at Sully, and the couple farmed near Taintor and Kellogg. They were the parents of one daughter, Kathryn. Mrs. Van Dyke died in November 1938.

On Dec. 28, 1943, Mr. Van Dyke was married to Lucille Rinegar at Searsboro. The cou-

ple had two children, Sharon and Donald Van Dyke. They farmed near Lynnville and in 1955 moved to a farm north of Grinnell. Mr. Van Dyke was a member of the Sully First Reformed Church and also attended the Grinnell First Friends Church.

He is survived by his wife, Lucille; his children, Kathryn Cos of Marshalltown, Sharon K. Van Dyke of Grinnell and Donald Van Dyke, also of Grinnell; five grandchildren; two sisters, Elizabeth DeKruyff of Otley and Gertrude DePenning of Pella; and one brother, Gert Van Dyke of Pella. He was preceded in death by his parents; his first wife, Sarah; two brothers, Paul and Ben Van Dyke; a sister, Cornelia Jacobs; and four brothers in infancy.
