

Van Waardhuizen rites held

John W. Van Waardhuizen, 45, of Pella died of injuries suffered in an auto accident Tuesday evening, April 3, at Pella Community Hospital.

Funeral services were held Saturday at the Second Reformed Church in Pella, with the Revs. Norman J. Schouten and Richard J. Lichti officiating. Pallbearers were Edward Keuning, Donald Van Hal, Clarence Wichart, Delmart Wichart, Ralph Wichart, and Ronald Wichart. Burial was in Oakwood Cemetery at Pella.

The son of Milton Arie and Esther Wichart Van Waardhuizen, he was born Feb. 16, 1939, in Pella. He attended public schools there, graduating from Pella High School in 1957. He then began his career with the Rolscreen Company as a printer.

He served with the U.S. Army Reserve in 1963,

graduating from the U.S. Army Southeastern Signal School in Fort Gordon, Ga.
