Charles M. VandeKamp, 70, of rural Gilman died at his home Thursday morning of an apparent heart attack. He was feeding cattle when stricken.

The son of Wynart and Mary Vanvliet VandeKamp, he was born Jan. 24, 1903, in Harvey, Iowa. He received his education in Prairie City. On Dec. 22, 1928, he was married to Violet Lukehart at New Hampton. The couple farmed in the St. Anthony and Clemons areas for six years before moving to Gilman, where they had lived since.

Mr. VandeKamp was a 4-H leader for several years, a member of the Gilman Saddle Club, a member of the Mid-Iowa Rock Club, and a former member of the Lions Club. He also was a member of the Gilman United Methodist Church.

Survivors include his wife, Violet; one son, Phillip of rural Gilman; four grandchildren, Tim, Sherry, Mark and Cindy; three sisters, Mrs. Ralph (Marguerite) Paul and Mrs. Oscar (Ruth) Newell, both of Gilman, and Mrs. Aaron (Marie) Stuck of Des Moines; and two brothers, Edward of Kellogg and Robert of Pella.

He was preceded in death by his parents, three brothers, and one sister.

Funeral services for Mr. VandeKamp were held at 1:30 p.m. Saturday at the Gilman United Methodist Church, with the Rev. Dr. O. Edward Cooley officiating. Burial was in Rose Hill Memorial Gardens.
