## Delmar Vander Pol 2-2-2000

Delmar Vander Pol, 78, of Lynnville died Jan. 20, 2000 at Pella Regional Health Center.

Graveside services and burial were Jan. 24 at St. Andrew's Lutheran Cemetery in Sully with the Rev. Allan R. Thoreson officiating.

On Jan. 16, he was admitted to Pella Regional Health Center.

Mr. Vander Pol's journey through life was an inspiration to many family members and friends. He enjoyed auto racing and riding motorcycles.

He was preceded in death by a great-grandson, Christian Van Soelen on March 19, 1996; his father Guy, who died Sept. 20, 1960; his mother, Maggie, who died June 12, 1968; his only sister, Dorothy Vander Pol, who passed away October 16, 1983 and his brother in law, Wayne Shutts, on died April 11, 1999.
