Hale F. Vanderveer, 69, of 1816 Eighth Ave., Grinnell, died Monday of cancer. *16-1/1*

Funeral services will be held this afternoon at St. John's Lutheran Church, with the Rev. Marcus E. Reitz, pastor of the church, officiating. Music will be provided by Mrs. Marvin Amo, organist, and Mrs. Howard McDonough and Mrs. Richard Petersen, vocalists. Pallbearers will be Ernest Blankenfeld, Frank Ferneau, Charles F. Kahler, Donald Killion, Lester W. Osborn, and Jack A. Templeton. Burial will be at Hazelwood Cemetery, with graveside rites conducted by Marion Gibson, commander; Edwin M. The son of James and Maude Foster Vanderveer, he was born Oct. 5, 1907, in Grinnell. He attended rural schools near Searsboro and graduated from Grinnell High School in 1927.

On Nov. 12, 1938, he was married to Estella Elizabeth Diehm in Grinnell. Mr. Vanderveer was a boiler operator at Grinnell College for 45 years. Following his retirement he had worked at the DeKalb Seed Corn plant. He was a member of the National Association of Power Engineers. During World War II, he served with the U.S. Navy aboard the U.S.S. General J. R. Brooke.

Survivors include his wife, Estella; a son, James Andrew Vanderveer of Grinnell; and two grandsons.
