Funeral Services Were Conducted From Methodist Church Monday Afternoon.

She was united in marriage to John Wallace on March 3, 1920, at the Methodist parsonage in Grinnell, the ceremony being performed by Rev. Mr. Wasser, pastor of the church at that time. To them were born three children, Maxine aged 4, Lorraine aged 2 and an infant son born April 21, 1928.

Esther was a perfect little mother with always kind and loving ways to her little ones. She was a devoted wife, daughter, and sister.
