

64 DIED 1-10-1896

WARD.—At the house of his son, F.  
L. Ward, in North Grinnell, Saturday  
evening, Jan. 10th, 1896, Milton Ward,  
of heart disease, in his 71st year.

Decedased was taken suddenly this same  
day evening at 7 o'clock, and by 9  
o'clock he breathed his last. The sym-  
ptoms were those of pneumonia, but  
it is thought his sudden death resulted  
from heart disease. Decedased was  
born in Philada. His name is Wili-  
am Ward, born Nov. 3rd, 1823, being one of the first set-  
tlers of Tipton county, Iowa. From there  
he moved to Rock Island county, Ill.,  
and four years ago to Spencer, Iowa.  
He was an active member of the Pres-  
byterian church at Spencer, and did  
much to build up the society there.  
His wife died in 1883, leaving him with  
six children, all of whom are now liv-  
ing and are expected to be present at  
the funeral. The remains will be trans-  
ferred to Rock Island county tomorrow  
for burial. He was sole heir, A. V. Ward, his  
eldest son at the time of his death.
