Mrs. Warner Is Stroke Victim Here Tuesday

Funeral services are being held early this afternoon for Mrs. C. C. Warner, age 70 years, well known Grinnell woman and prominent in church affairs, who died at her home here early yesterday morning, following an attack of apoplexy. The services will be held at the Congregational church, and burial will be at Freeport, Ill.

Mrs. Warner was well-known in Grinnell for her church activities both in this town and through the state. Several years ago, on account of failing health she had to give up this work.

Mrs. Warner had been in failing health for some time but insisted on casting her vote on election day. While going to the polls she felt ill and immediately after casting her ballot, while still in the booth, she suffered the stroke.

Mrs. Warner was born in Ottowa, Illinois and in 1889 was united in marriage with Charles C. Warner, a Congregational pastor. For many years they lived in Eldora and Monticello where Mr. Warner held pastorates. Following his death in 1916 Mrs. Warner moved to Grinnell to make a home for her daughter Marjorie who was a student at Grinnell college.

Surviving Mrs. Warner are, a daughter, Mrs. Marjorie Bouma who made her home with her mother and a son, Charles M. Warner of Minneapolis. Besides these two children there are seven grandchildren and a brother and sister, Dwight L. McNair of Evanston, Illinois and Mrs. L. B. Park of Hampstead, N.H.
