Mrs. Warnick lived most of her life in Hartwick and the surrounding community. She was switch-board operator for the Hartwick telephone company for several years.

Her health had been failing for the past few years and she had been living at the

Goeke nursing home in Montezuma the past year. She passed away Friday, October 25, at 3:30 p.m. at the age of 79 years 11 months and 27 days.

She is survived by her husband, Stahl; five children, Leo of Victor, Mrs. Lois Johnston of Cedar Rapids, Clark of Belle Plaine, Mrs. George Streit of Merritt Island, Florida and Edwin of Newton. Nine grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren; three brothers, Ora of Maren-go, Cliff of Brooklyn, Ronald of Hartwick.
