

Steven Wax rites Friday

Steven I. Wax, 29, of 530 Hamilton Ave. died Tuesday, Jan. 1, at Grinnell General Hospital of an apparent drug overdose.

Funeral services will be conducted at 1:30 p.m. Friday at the Smith Funeral Home, with the Rev. Daniel I. Ogata of the First United Presbyterian Church officiating. Organist will be Kathleen Heffner. Burial will be at Hazelwood Cemetery.

The son of Herman C. and Shirley Moore Wax, he was born Jan. 27, 1950, at Vinton. He attended school in that community, graduating from Washington High School in 1968. While in high school, he was a member of the Order of DeMolay. He also attended the

University of Iowa. During the Vietnam war, he served with a medical detachment at Camp Hood, Tex.

Following his discharge from the service, he was employed by the Wilson Co. in Cedar Rapids. He had lived in Grinnell for the past few months.

Survivors include his parents; a sister, Mrs. Gail Davis of Colorado Springs, Colo.; three brothers, James Wax of Grinnell, Wayne Wax of Cedar Rapids and John Wax of Grinnell; his paternal grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Joe Wax of Vinton; and his maternal grandmother, Mrs. Elsie Moore of Vinton. He was preceded in death by his sister, SueEllen Wax, in infancy.
