Genevieve H. Weaver, 77, of 926 Seeland Dr., Grinnell, died of Alzheimer's disease Friday, Jan. 17, at St. Francis Manor.

Memorial services were conducted Monday morning at the Gilman Community United Church of Christ, with the Rev. Rich Gamble officiating. Organist was Angie Hulin. Burial will be at a later date at Prairie View Cemetery, Gilman, with the Smith Funeral Home in charge of arrangements.

She was the daughter of Lee and Jennette Ingraham Munn and was born Sept. 23, 1919, near Laurel. She was raised on the family farm near Laurel and graduated from Laurel High School in 1936. She attended Grinnell College and studied music.

She was married to Robert Weaver June 26, 1941, at Gilman. During World War II, she lived in Washington, D.C., and served in the Office of Price Administration. Following the war, the couple lived in the Gilman area and farmed.

Mrs. Weaver worked as secretary to the superintendent of the Gilman school system and later for Citizens Savings Bank of Gilman. For 17 years she worked at the Wolfe Clinic in Marshalltown, retiring in 1982. She also operated a food catering business in Gilman for many years.

She was a previous member of the Gilman City Council and also served as mayor of Gilman during the 1970s.

She was a member of the Gilman Community United Church of Christ, Circle Ruth of the Church Guild, the Tea Day Progress Club and Eastern Star.

Surviving are her husband; one son, Tom of Quechee, Vt.; one daughter, Susan Pinette of Hartford, Conn.; one granddaughter; two brothers, Dwight Carey of Montezuma and Robert Carey of Ames; and two sisters, Grace McMinn and Marcia Mott, both of Long Boat Key, Fla. She was preceded in death by her parents.
