Claire Wemer died at Grinnell General Hospital on Sunday, March 5, at the age of 63.

Born on March 14, 1914, he was the son of Herman and Ruby Lester Wemer of Gibson. In his youth he attended Gibson schools, and, in 1934, he served as state president of the 4-H organization. In 1940 he graduated from Iowa State university in Ames.
