Edward Wenger 033 Of Guernsey Dies

Edward Frederick Wenger was born December 23, 1860, in Bureau county, 111. In 1866 his parents, John and Mary Wenger, moved to Jasper county, Iowa. Two years later they purchased from the federal government the farm near Guernsey, where Ed grew to manhood, being educated in the local schools. He was married February 16, 1886, to Lillie Sankey of Iowa county.
