Clarence M. "Clemmy" Wentland, 89, of 411 2nd Street, Victor, Ia., died Tuesday, April 18, 1989, at Mercy Hospital in Hospital.

He was the son of Mike and Emma McMahon Wentland and was born April 5, 1900, northeast of Victor.

He attended school at St. John's Parochial School in Victor. At the age of 16 he worked at the Schmidt Meat Market and in 1918 he and John Geis purchased the business. In 1946 the business became known as Wentland Grocery Store. He retired in 1975.

On May 22, 1934, he was married to Lorena Wetzstein at Victor. He had been a member of St. Bridget's Catholic Church in Victor, and he was a member of the Victoria Council of the Knights of Columbus.

He is survived by his wife, Lorena Wentland of Victor; one son, Michael Wentland of Victor; one daughter, Anne Wentland of Santa Rosa, Ca.; one grandson, Patrick Wentland of Victor; and his sister, Hazel Cahill of Victor.

He was preceded in death by his parents; two brothers, Harold and James Wentland; and one sister, Gladys Myers.

Funeral services were held at 11 a.m., Thursday, April 20, at the St. Bridget's Catholic Church with the Rev. Eugene Hoenig of St. Bridget's officiating. Organist was Mrs. Carol McLennan. Vocalist was St. Bridget's Choir. The Pall Bearers were Richard Park, Dennis Robinson, David York, Mark Cooling and Derry Gray, all of Victor and Howard Pippert of Dy-sart. Honorary Bearers were Raymond Gensley, Charles Seaton, John VanOtegham and John Van-Waus, and Mark Chvala, all of Victor.

Burial was in the Calvary Cemetery in Victor.
