He had kept on with his job on the sales end for a building firm in spite of his condition but was forced to retire four or five months ago. Funeral services were held Friday.

Survivors are his father, Harry I. Westlake of Los Angeles, who for many years was connected with the Spaulding Manufacturing company here, his wife, three daughters and five grandchildren.

Frank attended Grinnell college as a member of the class of 1910 but did not graduate. Possessor of a fine tenor voice he sang in the men's glee club and will be remembered as a member of a famous male quartet which included also Frank Jaqua, Ralph Lyman and Dave e Peck.

He had helped Mr. Moore with the promotion of several community music and sports events in Everett.
