Miss Julia Wheeler, who has valued, teacher in the Grinnell high school for many years, made her last official appearance in that capacity in the closing days of school last week. She is retiring after a long period of service to the hundreds of school pupils who have attended G. H. S. since she first joined the local high school teaching staff.

H-R Nov 4, 1954 Miss Julia Brookings Wheeler. retired school teacher and lifelong Grinnell resident, died early Wednesday morning, Nov. 3, following a long illness. She was 62 years old.

Miss Wheeler retired only recently after 40 years as a school teacher at Grinnell. She had taught many of the present Grinnell generations math at the local high school.

Born at Grinnell

Born Sept. 13, 1892 at Grinnell, she was the daughter of Wilmot Henry and Alice Heald Wheeler. She completed school here and entered the teaching profession, a career she followed for nearly half a century.
