

## At Home Near Lynnville

Thomas J. White was born in Henry county, Indiana, October 7, 1848, and departed this life March 31, 1925, at the age of 76 years, 5 months and 24 days.

He moved with his parents from Indiana to Poweshiek county, Iowa, when a small boy.

He was united in marriage with Caroline Patterson, Dec. 28, 1871. After their marriage they settled on a farm near Grinnell where they resided until 25 years ago, they moved to Jasper county, where they purchased a farm near Lynnville. At this place he spent the remainder of his life.

To this union were born four children, who with his wife survive him; Lewis and Roy of Grinnell, Edwin of Newton and Mrs. Arthur Cope of Sully. Also 14 grandchildren and a sister, Mrs. J. E. Patterson, of New Sharon.
