

Charles Wiedow Buried Wednesday

Funeral services for Charles H. Wiedow were held at 2 p.m. Wednesday, Sept. 28, at the Presbyterian Church in Deep River with the Rev. G. R. Dieken and the Rev. Wayne Fisher officiating.

Music was provided by soloist Dean Lankford accompanied by Mrs. George Dale at the piano.

Interment was in Golden Rod Cemetery with Jack Wise, Dennis Wolf, Donald Wolf, Paul Wiedow, Michael Murray, Sidney Montross, Stanley Montross and Edward Shepherd as casket bearers.

Mr. Wiedow, 82, died in Deep River on Sunday, Sept. 25.

The son of Elizabeth and Charles Wiedow, he was born on a farm in Lincoln Township, Iowa County, on Sept. 18, 1884. In his youth he attended rural school and St. John's Lutheran school for four years. He served an apprenticeship with a photography firm in Des

Moines and then established a business in his home.

On Oct. 15, 1910, he married Velda Farney. To this union seven children were born. They lived on a farm south of Victor until they moved to Deep River in 1937 where Mr. Wiedow was engaged in furniture repair and cabinet making.

After moving to Deep River Mr. Wiedow transferred his church membership to the Presbyterian Church and served as an elder and was active in church affairs. He served on the local school board for eight years.

Mr. Wiedow had been in failing health for several years and for the past six months he had been cared for in the home of Mrs. Amy Carver.

He is survived by his wife and their two sons, Harold and Clark; their four daughters, Elizabeth Cranston, Violet Wise, Alice Wolf and Adena Shepherd; 13 grand-

children; 15 great grandchildren; and one sister, Bertha Nywiede.
