Well Known Chester Boy Dies in Campbell, California, October 30

HAD BUT RECENTLY SPENT A YEAR IN CHESTER

Was Well Known And Liked by Those Who Knew Him While a Resident Here

From the Campbell, Calit., Press we learn of the death, Oct. 30, of one of Chester's former fine boys who grew into a useful and successful man. The Press says:

Funeral services were delayed until Friday, Nov. 5, so that his father, A. G. Williams, might return from Grinnell, where he has been living recently, to be present.

Mr. Worthin Williams was in former years editor of the Campbell Press and is well known among the older residents of the community, but since his return from the southern part of the state he has lived a rather retired life."
