

Set Services For Al Wilson ^{7/17/42}

Al Wilson, 71, of Lakeside Mobile Court, passed away early Monday morning (July 17) at Iowa Lutheran Hospital. He had been hospitalized for the past three weeks in Grinnell, and was taken to Des Moines Sunday morning.

He was the son of George and Geneva Walton Wilson, and was born at Allerton, Ia., April 19, 1901. His family moved to Albia shortly after his birth and he attended the Albia schools.

Mr. Wilson has lived in Grinnell for over 40 years and was employed as an interior-exterior painter. Before his retirement he was custodian at the Grinnell Newburg Junior High School for 14 years. He was a member of the Assembly of God church.

On April 19, 1944, he was married to Helen Ludden at

Rochester, Minn., who survives him. Also surviving is his brother, George Wilson of Ft. Madison, Iowa; as well as a number of nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his three brothers.
