

CHARLES E. WINCHELL

The son of Ralph R. and Hazel M. Garretson Winchell, Charles was born Aug. 7, 1920, at Malcom, Ia., and attended the Malcom schools. In 1944, he was married to Eva Marie Volkmer, and the couple continued to make Malcom their home. Charles was associated with his father in the operation of the Winchell Oil Company in Malcom, and in the family trucking business, until his health failed. Survivors include his children: Jerry Winchell of Hood River, Ore.; and Judy Phillips of Knoxville; three grandchildren: Terri Phillips Marsh of Pleasantville; Scott Phillips of Knoxville; and Joe Winchell of the U.S. Navy. Charles died Friday, Sept. 9, 1988, at the age of 68 at Grinnell General Hospital of cancer. He made his home at the New Sharon Care Center since July.
