

Deep River Man Is 4th Traffic Victim

Poweshiek county's fourth traffic death of 1964 was recorded early Monday afternoon when Edwin Wolf, 81, Deep River area farmer, died at the Mahaska county hospital in Os-kaloosa.

Wolf succumbed to injuries received May 9, when the tractor he was driving near Deep River was involved in a collision with a truck. He was thrown from the machine and suffered a broken pelvis.

Driver of the pickup truck, Ralph C. Burck of Millersburg, was not injured.

The other three fatalities all occurred during June. On June 4th, Joseph Lacina of rural Grinnell died of injuries received in a two-car crash on highway 146 about six miles south of Grinnell.

Mrs. Elsie May of rural Malcom was the second victim, killed in the collision of a car

and truck June 13th at the intersection of two gravel roads about four miles north of the Malcom junction of highways 6 and 63.

Third death was on June 24th and the victim was Ernest K. Bodine of Haddonfield, N. J. He died following a two-car accident at the junction of highway 146 and Interstate 80 about three miles south of Grinnell.

Funeral services for Edwin Wolf were held Wednesday afternoon from the Deep River Presbyterian church, with the Rev. Glenn Dieken, pastor, officiating. Burial was in Goldenrod cemetery near Deep River.

He is survived by a son, Alton of Deep River; a daughter, Mrs. Hazel Wyant of Deep River; five grandchildren; and three sisters, Mrs. Ben Martinson of Clinton, Mrs. Clara Baldwin of Sedalia, Colo., and Mrs. Viola Scott of Cedar Rapids.

**Highway Accident
Injuries Take Life
Of Edwin Wolf** *MR*

Funeral services for Edwin Wolf were conducted at 1:30 p.m. July 10 at the Presbyterian church in Deep River by the Rev. G. R. Dieken. Mrs. George Dale played the musical selections.

Interment was in Golden Rod cemetery under direction of the Steffy Funeral Home. Casket bearers were Gerald Rieck, Quentin Rose, Harold Wiedow, Max Icenbice, Farrell Johnson and Glenn Holderness.

Edwin, son of Mary and Adam Wolf, was born in Washington township, Iowa county, Sept. 6, 1881, and died at the Mahaska hospital, Oskaloosa, July 8 at 81 years of age.

He attended rural school and helped with the farm work.

On Aug. 23, 1909, he was united in marriage with Julia Hoenig, and to this union, two children were born. They made their home on a farm near Marengo for three years, then they moved to their home east of Deep River. Since the death of Mrs. Wolf in 1960, he has maintained his home on the farm.

In his youth he was baptised in the Swedenburg New Jerusalem church, later transferred his membership to the Deep River Presbyterian church, where he has been a faithful member.
