Warren "Bud" Joseph Wolf, 82, of the Mayflower died Thursday, Nov. 23, at Grinnell Regional Medical Center.

Funeral services were conducted Sunday at the Grinnell Christian Church, with the Rev. John Epperson officiating. Organist was Jolene Jones, and pallbearers were Danny Carroll, John Green, Jim LaCasse, Curt Lang, Ray Lang, Terry Lowry and Jack Morrison.

Burial was Monday at Graceland Cemetery, Webster City, with the Smith Funeral Home in charge of arrangements.

He was the son of William J. and Lela Dunlap Wolf and was born Sept. 10, 1913, on the family farm near Woolstock. He attended rural school. He worked on various farms near Webster City and later at a John Deere implement store in Jewell. He was a World War II veteran of the U.S. Army.

On July 9, 1943, he was married to Dorothy Henderson in Bethany, Mo. The couple lived in Webster City where he was employed by the Stafford Implement Co. for many years. They later moved to Grinnell and lived at the Mayflower.

Mr. Wolf was employed as maintenance director at the Mayflower and received the National Employee of the Year award in 1975 in Philadelphia. He retired in 1980.

He was a member of the Grinnell Christian Church, serving as deacon and elder. He was also a member of the American Legion.

Surviving are his wife; two sons, Robert of Forest City, N.C., and William of Dallas, Texas; and two grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his parents and four brothers, Clifton, Everett, Howard and one in infancy.
