Fred A. Wolfe Dies In Florida

Fred A. Wolfe, 58, former president of the Poweshick County National Bank, died Tuesday in Providence, R.I. He had been on a trip to that area.

Mr. Wolfe was president of the bank here until 1966, when he resigned because of ill health. Since that time he had made his home in Winter Park, Fla.

Born April 15, 1910, on a farm near Shannon City, Ia., Mr. Wolfe graduated from the high school there in the spring of 1927, after which he attended Simpson College in Indianola.

He taught school for a number of years and completed his college work in 1935, after which he did graduate work in school administration. Later he graduated from the Central States School of Banking at Madison, Wis.

In 1933 Mr. Wolfe married Beulah Flesher of Indianola. The couple had one son, Jerry, now a Florida resident.

Mr. Wolfe began working for the Poweshiek County National Bank in 1946, where he was promoted to assistant cashier, cashier, vice president, executive vice president and, finally, president in January of 1963.

He was past president of the Grinnell Rotary Club, and also served as a director of Uncle Sam's Club and Community Hospital. He belonged to the Grinnell Methodist Church, Hermon Lodge, A.F. & A.M., and was a member of the local Elks. He is listed in "Who's Who."

Funeral services for Mr. Wolfe are scheduled for Saturday, Sept. 21, at a Winter Park funeral home. Burial will also be at Winter Park.
