

Last Rites Said ^{August 10, 1967} For Mrs. Wortman *H-2*

Mrs. Anna M. Wortman, 75, of 1110 1/2 Broad St., died late Monday evening at St. Francis Hospital where she had been a patient the past two weeks.

The daughter of Peter and Eva Heisel Harter, Mrs. Wortman was born south of Grinnell on March 29, 1892. She was a lifelong resident of Grinnell and had been employed in the laundry department at Grinnell College.

Mrs. Wortman was a member of St. Mary's Catholic church and the Altar and Rosary Society. She was also a Gold Star Mother as a result of the death of her son, 2nd Lt. Wilbur J. Wortman of the Army Air Force, on July 26, 1944.

Survivors include one son — Leo B. Mrs. Wortman was preceded in death by her parents, her son Wilbur, one granddaughter and one sister who died in infancy.

Requiem Low Mass for Mrs. Anna Wortman was said at 10 a.m. today at St. Mary's Catholic Church with the Rev. Leo V. Kuebrich, pastor of the church, officiating. The Rosary was said at 7:30 p.m. Wednesday at the Smith Funeral Home.
