Carrie Alice Wright, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. James Nichols, was born in Putman county, Missouri, December 23, 1874, and passed away at the Community hospital Sunday evening, October 6, at 7:30 o'clock, at the age of 60 years, 10 months and 17 days.

She was united in marriage to Thomas Wright January 1, 1890, at Graysville, Missouri, To this union were born nine children, of whom seven survive her, two daughters preceding her in death, Vida having died at the age of one year, and Valec at the age of seventeen. She leaves to mourn her loss, her husband, five daughters, Mrs. Carl Crooks (Verna) of Springfield, Ohio, Mrs. " , David Shadden (Vertie) of Tama; Mrs. Fred Roop (Violet) and Mrs. Ralph Thompson (Vesta) of Grinnell; Mrs. Ike Howard (Villard) of Sully; and two sons, Von of Montezuma and Vursel of Grinnell; one sister Mrs. Anna Losey of Grinnell; one aunt; twelve grandchildren, two having preceded her in death: two great grandchildren; nieces and three nephews.
