

## Last Rites Monday For Leslie Wylie

A heart attack claimed the life of Leslie Wylie, 73, last Friday morning at his home south of Brooklyn. Mr. Wylie, who had lived in this community most of his life, had always enjoyed good health and his death occurred suddenly while he was working in the farm yard.

Funeral services were conducted Sunday afternoon at two o'clock at First United Presbyterian church in charge of George W. Roquet, pastor. Organist was Mrs. Ed Bartachek. In charge of floral arrangements were Mr. and Mrs. I. H. McIlrath and Dr. and Mrs. J. M. Barclay.

Leslie Forrest Wylie, son of Alex Wylie and Anger Paul Wylie, was born July 7, 1891, in Jasper county, Iowa. When he was a young boy, he came with his family to this community.

He was married to Coralie Stockman in Des Moines May 18, 1916. Mr. Wylie had been a member of the Presbyterian church in Brooklyn for many years and had served as elder for nearly 25 years.

He is survived by his wife; two children, Ross of Brooklyn and Mrs. Andrew (Esther) Hocker of Marengo, and six grandchildren, Randall and Susan Wylie and Charles, James, Dennis and David Hocker. He also leaves two brothers and four sisters.
